St Peter's is the Parish Church of Thundersley.

About 900 years ago to present day

BEFORE: Thundersley was a very small place full of fields. Only 12 families lived here according to the Domesday Book. A church was built called St. Michael's.

WHAT HAPPENED: 100 years later-on Christmas Day- there was a fire and most of it burnt down. A new church was built called St .Peter's. Roman bricks were used. In Tudor times, Queen Elizabeth I gave the church a bell. In Victorian times the chancel was re-built.

AFTER: In modern times a new extension was built.
