Millie Smith (Kestrels) tells of her exciting experience in respect of the dance below:-



"Every lunchtime on a Wednesday, we have been practicing with Miss Lane our dance. We got to the Palace Theatre and we saw the rehearsals at the bottom of the seats and there were 3 rows. After the rehearsals were done we sat at the top. Then we had to wait an hour to perform and watched all the other dances. First we had to go backstage to line up 3 dances





before our dance to get ready and then run on when it was our turn. I felt excited when I was waiting. When we went on, we could only see the first few rows in the light as the rest was in the dark. The dance went well and everyone got it right and made it. I felt good to perform it and let other people see our dance. After we did our dance everyone was clapping and it felt great. I also liked the Deanes dance as they did the same Bye, Bye, Bye one but the full version. I loved the whole experience lots."

Eleny Grover (Fireflies) gives details of her experience with the Choir:-



"When we got there, we sat down in our seats but not our proper seats and we watched some other rehearsals and then it was our turn. After that we went to our proper seats which were on the top level and we could eat our snacks. Then we had time to talk and played some games and talked to the teachers before the actual show started. We were the third act. We had to walk onto the back stage quietly because another act was on and then it was our turn to get into our positions on the stage. Our first song was Six and after we sang that song we sang 'How to swim'. I felt nervous but excited at the beginning but at the end I felt thankful. I really did enjoy it. When everyone was clapping I felt proud and happy. My mummy, daddy and brother came to watch me and they said 'You were amazing and had the biggest smile we could see." I would really like to do something like that again. I love being in the Choir. I am also used to going to the Palace Theatre as I dance there too."







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Bikeability

Group 1 of the Year 5 children have been participating in Bikeability this week (formerly Cycling Proficiency). Miss Turner-Powell, one of the coaches, said that the children were amazing, picked up the riding skills and instructions on how to keep safe on the roads so quickly and should be really proud of themselves. Ed Payne (Ants) gives an insight into the course below:-



"On the first day we learned about signalling, pulling out and stopping. We also learned how to check our bikes over like seats, brakes and how to fit our helmets correctly. On day two we learned about rolling 'U' turns and stop 'U' turns and going around parked cars. We also learned how to do the checks for putting our bikes in the road. On day three we went out onto the roads by the common. I felt a bit nervous going onto the busier roads but it was a bit better after a while. On day four we went back out and went along Kenneth Road and Hart Road. It was quite a lot busier than day three as there were a lot of cars passing but we soon pulled off. Then we went back to near the common and did right and left turns out. We then went on our bike ride which was good and then came back to school. I thought the whole course was really fun and I feel more confident riding on the roads now."


