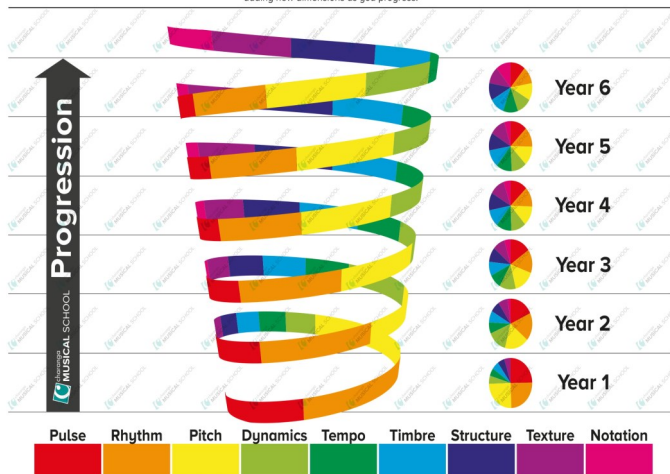


**The Interrelated Dimensions of Music**  
Progression through Charanga Musical School

Progression throughout the Units of Work reinforces the interrelated dimensions of music.

With each new song, always start again with the foundation of pulse, then rhythm, then pitch, adding new dimensions as you progress.

What I should already know

I can listen to a variety of musical styles including Blues, Baroque and Irish Folk

I can copy and clap back rhythms

I know that pitch is high or low sounds

I can improvise using the notes C and D

I can play an accompaniment using up to 3 notes.

Vocabulary

Keyboard	An electric instrument played like the piano. It has a range of pre-recorded sounds.
Bass	the member of a family of instruments that is the lowest in pitch.
Audience	the assembled spectators or listeners at a public event such as a play, film, concert, or meeting
Imagination	creating images of things in your mind that are not really there

Your Imagination—opportunities are given to appraise a variety of songs inspired by the Imagination. Including:

'Supercalifragilisticexpialidocious' is a song from the 1964 Disney musical film Mary Poppins.

The song was written by the Sherman Brothers, and sung by Julie Andrews and Dick Van Dyke.

'Supercalifragilisticexpialidocious' is a nonsense, made-up word that you can use when you have no other words to describe how fantastic something is! The song is about using your imagination.

'Rainbow Connection' was written by songwriters Paul Williams and Kenny Ascher for The Muppet Movie, which came out in 1979.

- In the film, it is sung by Kermit The Frog as the Muppets set out to find adventure.

- Kermit is sitting in the middle of the swamp, thinking about life. He is on a spiritual path, examining life, and its meaning. He is singing about rainbows and wondering if he believes in them and it turns out that he does.

'A Whole New World' is a song from Disney's 1992 animated feature film Aladdin, with music by Alan Menken and lyrics by Tim Rice.
