The Great Fire of London

Year 2

BEFORE: There had been a drought in **London**; the city was very dry.

Houses were made from wood and straw which burned easily. The houses were close together. The streets were very dirty.

WHAT HAPPENED? The **Great Fire of London** began in a bakery in Pudding Lane. It lasted four days. Samuel Pepys, a member of parliament, wrote about it in his diary.

AFTER: London was re-built using bricks and stones. The first fire brigades were formed. We sing the nursery rhyme 'London's burning'.

Interpretation 'London burnt down' Use evidence— paintings, The Monument in London, Samuel Pepys' diary to find out where, when, how, why.
