

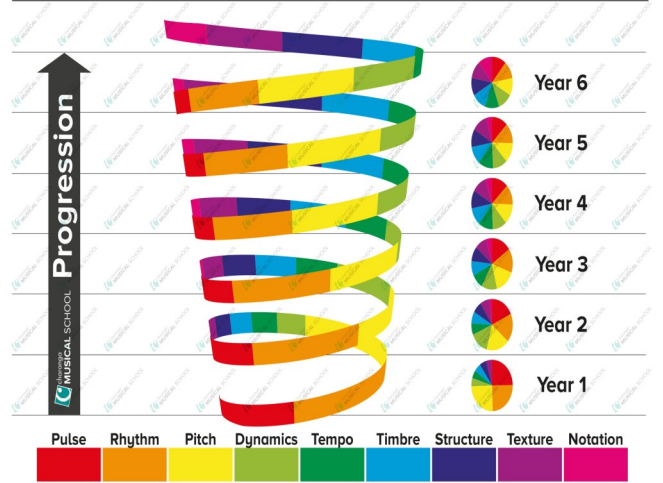
What I should already know

- I understand the terms: pulse, rhythm, pitch, dynamics, solo, tempo, bridge syncopation

The Interrelated Dimensions of Music
Progression through Charanga Musical School



Progression throughout the Units of Work reinforces the interrelated dimensions of music. With each new song, always start again with the foundation of pulse, then rhythm, then pitch, adding new dimensions as you progress. This represents an ever increasing spiral of musical learning.



Vocabulary

Interlude	a passage of music played between the main themes
Tag	a short ending, tagged on to the main part of the song
Cover	version of a song performed by someone other than the original artist that might sound different
Riff	short repeated phrase, often played by the lead instrument such as: guitar, piano or saxophone
Hook	a short catchy phrase or riff that you cant stop singing
Deck	equipment used by DJs, MCs & Rappers to mix sounds to make effects like scratching

Make you Fell my Love—Adele

This is a pop ballad—a gentle, emotive love song, sung at slow tempo. It was written by Bob Dylan in 1997 and covered by Adele in 2008.

Other pop ballads

- Hello—Lionel Ritchie
- Love me Tender—Elvis Presley

Sing, play instrument parts with the song, improvise using up to 3 notes, compose using simple rhythms and perform.
