

Gustavus Theodore von Holst was born in Cheltenham on 21st September, 1874. He attended the Royal College of Music in London where he studied composition and met fellow student, Ralph Vaughan Williams, another

famous composer. Holst became a teacher and composed in his spare time. He died in 1934.
